What is our favorite quote we learned from Marilyn? "I'd just love to."





Elizabeth Rogers turned 100 in 2017. She is celebrating her 103th birthday! She will be 104 on September 22.

Elizabeth is the only surviving charter member of Alpha Lambda, which was organized on March 1, 1958. At that time, Alpha Lambda included Henderson and Transylvania Counties. She became the fourth AL president in the biennium 1964-66. In 1982, Transylvania members formed a new chapter, Gamma Upsilon. Elizabeth resigned from DKG in 1996 and reinstated in 2005. While it has been 64 years since she joined DKG, she was active for 55. Elizabeth taught social studies and Latin at Flat Rock when it was a high school and then at East.
